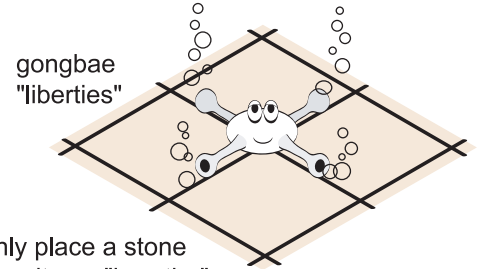


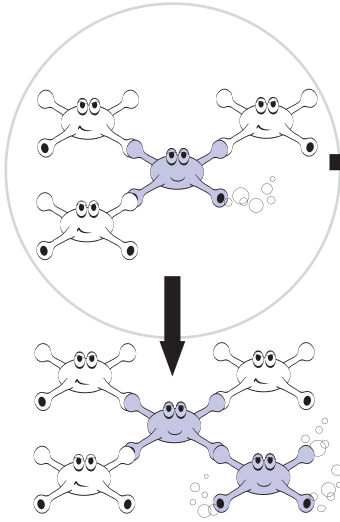
1. Two players take turns putting a stone of their color where the lines meet. The more experienced player lets their opponent take the first move, using black pieces. When it is your turn, you can also pass (do nothing).

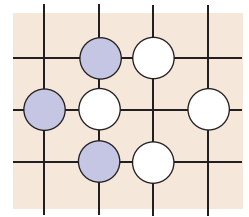
2. You can only place a stone on a spot where it can "breathe".  
(Capture comes *before* checking for breathing.)

4. If one player captures a stone in a Ko, the other may not recapture there on the very next turn.



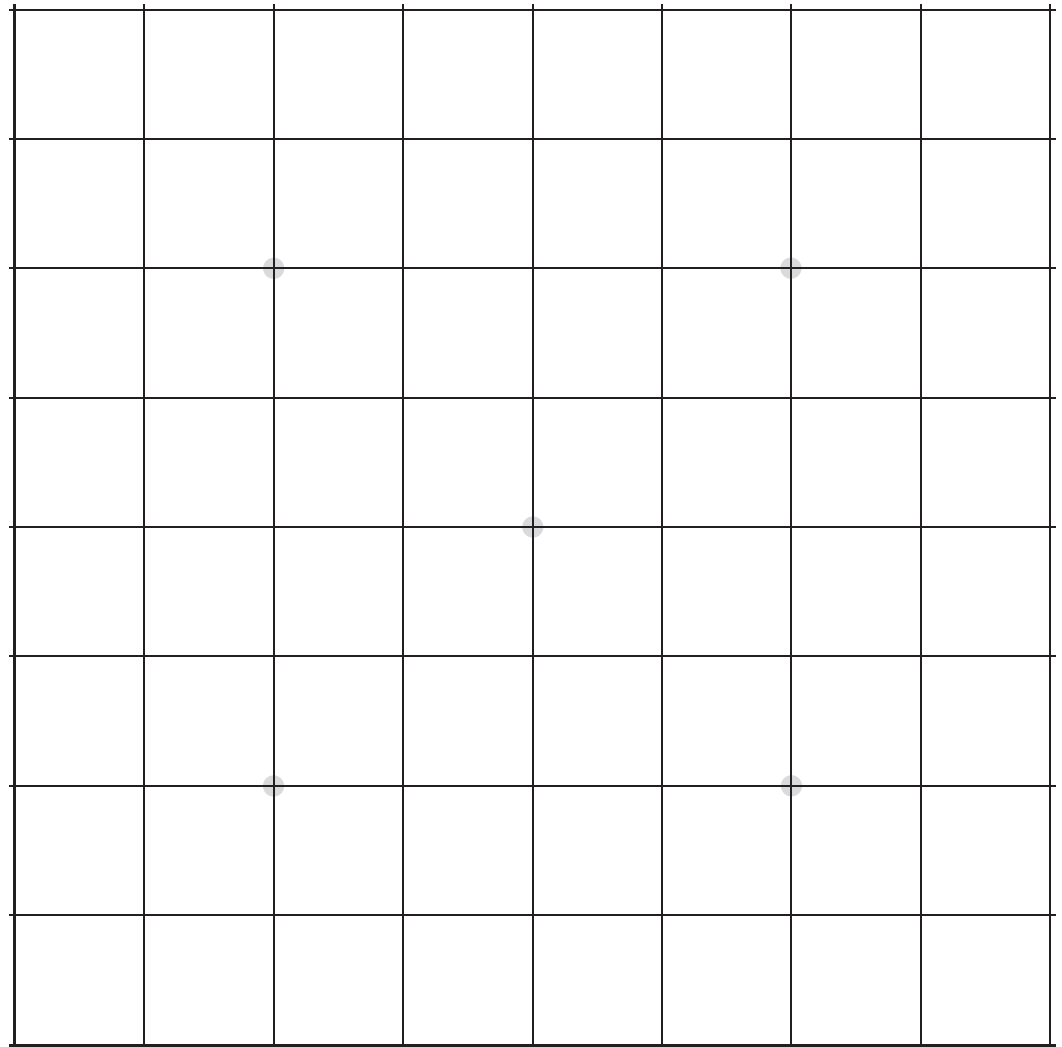
3. Adjacent stones (horizontal or vertical) share liberties. A stone or group of stones with no liberties is "captured", and removed from the board.

### PAE ("Ko")



The object of the game is to surround empty spots. A spot surrounded by both sides scores no points.

The game ends when both players agree that they are done.
